Lent 1 (B)

THEME :Today we hear how Jesus began his ministry. He was tempted in the desert for forty days of solitude, fasting and praying and returned to proclaim the powerful message of God – repent and believe the Good News. St. Peter explains how, by baptism, we join our lives to Christ and are saved, just as Noah and his family were saved by water long ago.

OPENING PRAYER : *Let us pray that this Lent will help us reproduce in our lives the self-sacrificing love of Christ. Father, through our observance of Lent help us to understand the meaning of your Son's death and resurrection and teach us to reflect it in our lives. Amen*

LITURGY OF THE WORD OF GOD

First Reading – Genesis 9 v 8-15. God's covenant with Noah was not solely with Noah and his sons. It was a promise of the continuance of life and a sign of God's eternal fidelity to his people.

God spoke to Noah and his sons, 'See, I establish my Covenant with you, and with your descendants after you; also with every living creature to be found with you, birds, cattle and every wild beast with you: everything that came out of the ark, everything that lives on the earth. I establish my Covenant with you: no thing of flesh shall be swept away again by the waters of the flood. There shall be no flood to destroy the earth again.'

God said, 'Here is the sign of the Covenant I make between myself and you and every living creature with you for all generations: I set my bow in the clouds and it shall be a sign of the Covenant between me and the earth. When I gather the clouds over the earth and the bow appears in the clouds, I will recall the Covenant between myself and you and every living creature of every kind. And so the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all things of flesh.'

Responsorial Psalm - Psalm 24

® **Your ways, Lord are faithfulness and love for those who keep your covenant.**

Lord, make me know your ways; Lord, teach me your paths.

Make me walk in your truth and teach me, for you are God my Saviour. ®

Remember your mercy, Lord and the love you have shown from of old.
In your love remember me because of your goodness, O Lord. ®

The Lord is good and upright, he shows the path to those who stray
he guides the humble in the right path; he teaches his way to the poor ®

Second Reading – 1 Peter 3 v 18-22. Under the old covenant, water cleansed the earth by destroying man. Noah is saved from water. In the New Covenant water saves man by cleansing him in Baptism. Those in the new ark, the Church, who believe and are saved by the waters of Baptism are identified with Christ's death and resurrection.

Christ himself, innocent though he was, died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life, and, in the spirit, he went to preach to the spirits in prison. Now it was long ago, when Noah was still building that ark which saved only a small group of eight people 'by water', and when God was still waiting patiently, that these spirits refused to believe. That water is a type of the baptism which saves you now, and which is not the washing off of physical dirt but a pledge made to God from a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has entered heaven and is at God's right hand, now that he has made the angels and Dominations and Powers his subjects.

Gospel Hymn: 165 v.3

Gospel - Mark 1 v 12-15. Jesus does battle with the elements of the desert and comes back from his trials to preach the Gospel.

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the wilderness and he remained there for forty days, and was tempted by Satan. He was with the wild beasts, and the angels looked after him.

After John had been arrested, Jesus went into Galilee. There he proclaimed the Good News from God. 'The time has come' he said 'and the kingdom of God is close at hand. Repent, and believe the Good News.'

Let us pray for those who are sick, especially HM King Charles, Taylor Birch, Mike Galloway, Jim Wilson, Angie Wilson, Jean Martin, Jan Ross, Jessica Mercer, Billy Carter, Margaret Maundrell and all prayed for at Shrine prayers.

We pray for all our deceased relatives and friends and for all whom we have been asked to pray; that the Lord would bring them to his kingdom in heaven. We pray for Lois Pitcher, recently departed (*pause while a candle is lit*) and Pam Thorpe, John Juby, Frank Smith, Anand Nair, Joyce Jackaman, Fr.
