PARISH CHURCH OF ST. MARY THE VIRGIN, MENDLESHAM PALM SUNDAY

Theme: God calls us in this Holy Week to follow closely in the path of Jesus, his Son. May we enter into the mystery of the Lord's death this week, and rise with him to a changed life and a new hope at Easter.

Distribution and Blessing of Palms: Assemble in the Churchyard.

Palm Sunday Gospel - Matthew 21 v. 1 - 11. Hymn in Procession: 8. IN CHURCH Opening Prayer: Let us pray for a closer union with Christ during this holy season. Almighty, ever-living God, you have given the human race Jesus Christ our Saviour as a model of humility. He fulfilled your will by becoming man and giving his life on the cross. Help us to bear witness to you by following his example of suffering and make us worthy to share in his resurrection.

Liturgy Of The Word Of God

1st Reading: Isaiah 50 v. 4-7 The Lord's servant, the perfect model of the disciple and the teacher, suffers out of fidelity to his mission.

'The Lord has given me a disciple's tongue. So that I may know how to reply to the wearied he provides me with speech. Each morning he wakes me to hear, to listen like a disciple. The Lord has opened my ear. For my part, I made no resistance, neither did I turn away. I offered my back to those who struck me, my cheeks to those who tore at my beard; I did not cover my face against insult and spittle. The Lord comes to my help, so that I am untouched by the insults. So, too, I set my face like flint; I know I shall not be shamed.'

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 21 ® My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?

All who see me deride me they curl their lips, they toss their heads 'He trusted in the Lord, let him save him; Let him release him if this is his friend.'®

2. Many dogs have surrounded me a band of the wicked beset me They tear holes in my hands and my feet I can count every one of my bones.®

3. They divide my clothing among them they cast lots for my robe
O Lord do not leave me alone
my strength, make haste to help me!®

4. I will tell of your name to my brethren and praise you where they are assembled.

You, who fear the Lord given him praise; all sons of Jacob, give him glory. Revere him, Israel's sons.®

2nd Reading: Philippians $2 ext{ v. } 6-11$. In this passage St. Paul is quoting a hymn which was written within a few years of the Resurrection of Our Lord. It emphasises the obedience and the humility of Christ. And it is precisely for this reason that he is our Lord and Master.

'His state was divine, yet Christ Jesus did not cling to his equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave and became as men are; and being as all men are, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross.

But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, to the glory of God the Father.'

Hymn: 271.

All: Praise to you, O Christ, King of eternal glory: Christ was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross. But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all names. Praise to you, O Christ, King of eternal glory.

Passion Reading: Matthew 26. (printed in Holy Week Book)

The story of our Lord's suffering and death was written down later and presented in the light of the resurrection. God's plan of salvation can be seen throughout the events. St. Matthew stresses that Jesus is Lord throughout these sufferings and that he chooses the path of humility.

Address Creed (Apostles' Creed - P8 of Hymn Book.)

Prayer of the Faithful:

Celebrant: Jesus shows us the way of Life. It is the path of loving obedience to the Father. It costs no less than everything and so we ask that his people remain faithful to his way.

Reader: Let us pray for missionaries who spread the Good News of the Lord's death and resurrection. May they preach the word with conviction and effect.

We pray for peace in our troubled world; to strained relationships, broken homes and war-ridden nations, especially Ukraine, Syria and the Yemen.

We pray for those in our own country who see this week as nothing more than a time of holiday. Jesus came to give them new life also. May they have the opportunity to hear his word through us and take it to heart.

Let us pray for ourselves and the whole Church of God. May the celebration of the mysteries of Christ during this Holy Week renew our hearts and minds.

We pray for all those who are crucified with Christ through oppression and torture. May the world see in them the face of Christ, whose cross and resurrection set us free.

We pray for all those who are involved in caring for suffering in the world; doctors, nurses, healthcare workers, relief workers and for all who support them with their generosity; may they be encouraged by the Holy Spirit.

Let us pray for all those who are sick; especially Jose Pereira, Angela Wilson, Jan Robinson, Julie Gray, for our parishioners in homes and also the lonely and depressed; may they experience God's presence in their sickness or distress.

On this Palm Sunday let us bring to God's love every meeting, demonstration, and all large crowds, that they be peaceful and ordered, inspiring those present for good rather than inciting them to violence.

We bring to God's love those from whom we are separated by death.
