Lent VI - PALM SUNDAY

Theme: Holy Week begins today with remembrance of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem and the reading of the account of His passion, when He died for our redemption. Let us pray that during this coming week we may follow our Saviour more closely.

Blessing of Palms in Churchyard

Palm Sunday Gospel: Mark 11 v 1 – 10.

When they were approaching Jerusalem, in sight of Bethphage and Bethany, close by the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples and said to them, 'Go off to the village facing you, and as soon as you enter it you will find a tethered colt that no one has yet ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone says to you "What are you doing?" say, "The Master needs it and will send it back here directly." 'They went off and found a colt tethered near a door in the open street. As they untied it, some men standing there said, 'What are you doing, untying that colt?' They gave the answer Jesus had told them, and the men let them go. Then they took the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on its back, and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, others greenery which they had cut in the fields. And those who went in front and those who followed were all shouting, 'Hosanna! Blessings on him who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessings on the coming kingdom of our father David! Hosanna in the highest heavens!'

Procession into church Hymn 8.

Opening Prayer: Let us pray for a closer union with Christ during this Holy season. Almighty, ever-lasting God, you have given the human race Jesus Christ our Saviour as a model of humility. He fulfilled your will by becoming man and giving his life on the Cross. Help us to bear witness to you by following his example of suffering and make us worthy to share in his resurrection.

Liturgy of The Word Of God:

1st Reading: Isaiah 50 v 4 – 7 In one of the servant songs the prophet Isaiah presents the suffering servant as the innocent and noble disciple who faces affliction with the help of God.

The Lord has given me a disciple's tongue. So that I may know how to reply to the wearied he provides me with speech. Each morning he wakes me to hear, to listen like a disciple. The Lord has opened my ear. For my part, I made no resistance, neither did I turn away. I offered my back to those who struck me, my cheeks to those who tore at my beard; I did not cover my face against insult and spittle. The Lord comes to my help, so that I am untouched by the insults. So, too, I set my face like flint; I know I shall not be shamed.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 21 ® My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?

All who see me deride me. They curl up their lips, they toss their heads. He trusted in the Lord, let him save him; let him release him if this is his friend.' ®

Many dogs have surrounded me, A band of the wicked beset me.

They tear holes in my hands and feet I can count every one of my bones. $\ensuremath{\mathbb{R}}$

® My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?

They divide my clothing among them. They cast lots for my robe. O Lord, do not leave me alone, my strength, make haste to help me! ®

I will tell of your name to my brethren and praise you where they are assembled. You who fear the Lord give him praise; All sons of Jacob, give him glory, Revere him, Israel's sons.

2nd Reading: Philippians 2 v. 6 - 11. From an ancient hymn we hear how Christ, even though divine, emptied himself to become as we are and humbled himself by dying on the Cross. God raised him to be Lord of all.

His state was divine, yet Christ Jesus did not cling to his equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave and became as men are; and being as all men are, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a Cross.

But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Gospel Hymn: 355

Acclamation: **Praise to you, O Christ, King of eternal glory. Christ was humbler** yet, even to accepting death on a Cross. But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all names. Praise to you O Christ, King of eternal glory.
